Bass Ackwards, dir. Linas Phillips, 103m

Alternating between scripted action, improvisation, and the unpredictable spontaneity of verite encounters, BASS ACKWARDS is the semi-autobiographical story of Linas Phillips, who stars as well as directs. A captivating and consummately human film that reminds us that whatever we think the road is about, the trip is probably about something else.

Bomber, dir. Paul Cotter, 84m

A bittersweet comedy about love, family and dropping bombs on Germany. An 83 year-old man returns to Germany for a long planned journey of atonement. When Ross, his useless son agrees to drive him there, a nightmare family road trip ensues.

Dance with the One, dir. Mike Dolan, 83m

An emotionally explosive thriller set in the troubled heart of Texas. Tragic family history rises to the surface when a teenager races to protect his family from a lethal drug-runner.

Disrupt/Dismantle, dirs. Jack Lucarelli & Troy Price, 110m

Eight elite L.A. undercover narcotics cops, disregard the law to bring down the most powerful drug mob in the U.S. Loosely based on the true story of Mexico's once most powerful and seductive drug cartel leader, The Black Widow,.

Forget Me Not, dir. Alexander Holt, 93m

Love Happens. When you least expect it....Forget Me Not is a touching, modern day love story set against a sweeping London backdrop.

Inventing Adam, dir. Richie Adams, 90m

A young man struggles whether or not to follow his dream as he approaches his 30th birthday.

My Girlfriend's Boyfriend, dir. Daryn Tufts, 90m

The story of a girl who meets her one true love... Twice.

Race Walkers, dir. Dan Liechty, 91m

Elite race walking brothers Jeb and Joel Callahan must find a way to qualify for the Olympic Trials in Eugene, Oregon or suffer the reality of small town failure and the perpetual scrutiny of the athletic world.

The Assistants, dir. Steve Morris, 99m

They are the eyes and ears of Hollywood. Every script, every contract, every birthday card passes through they're hands. If they ever pooled their resources there's nothing they couldn't do.

Documentaries

A Blooming Business, dir. Ton van Zantvoort

"A Blooming Business" is a poetic documentary about people in Kenya who are imprisoned by the power of the global flower growing industry.

A Surprise in Texas, dir. Peter Rosen, 68m

In May 2009, 29 young contestants came from all over the world to compete in the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in Fort Worth Texas, the most prestigious prize in the music world. This is the story of one of them, a 20 year old from Tokyo, Nobuyuki Tsujii, blind from birth.

A Village Called Versailles, dir. S. Leo Chiang, 68m

Their homes destroyed. Their voice discovered.

Being in the World, dir. Tao Ruspoli, 76m

Being in the World is a celebration of human beings, and our ability, through the mastery of physical, intellectual and creative skills, to find meaning in the world around us. In this film, Hubert Dreyfus takes us on a gripping and surprising journey around the world meeting extraordinary people, showing how we go from following rules to proficiency, to becoming masters in the form artists, craftsmen, athletes, and, ultimately, unique human beings attuned to the sacred.

Contact, dir. Bentley Dean, 78m

In 1964, Yuwali was 17 when her first contact with white men was filmed. Her group of 20 women and children were the last aboriginal mob living traditionally, without any knowledge of modern Australia, in the Great Sandy Desert. Now 62 she tells the story behind this extraordinary footage.

Operation Babylift: The Lost Children of Vietnam, dir. Tammy Nguyen Lee

"Operation Babylift" was a \$2 million dollar US initiative that airlifted over 2,500 Vietnamese orphans out of a war-torn country to protect them from the impending threat of the Communist Regime. Coined by some as "one of the most humanitarian efforts in history," it was also plagued by lawsuits and political turmoil. Even with the best intentions, these adoptees grew up facing a unique set of challenges in America, including prejudice overshadowed by a controversial war and cultural identity crisis. Nearly 35 years later, this documentary takes a candid look at a significant yet untold event as seen through the eyes of the volunteers, parents, and organizations directly involved, as well as uncovers the "lost" stories of the adoptees and who they have become as adults.

Saving Carren, dir. Heather Arment & Deborah Gragory, 53m

Saving Carren documents the true story of a retired cop who watches his daughter fall prey to the destructive power of methamphetamines, a young woman whose father risks everything to save her, and the love that brings them both back from the brink of death. Alternating between intimate filmed monologue and stark animation Saving Carren is at once haunting and beautiful.

The Elephant in the Living Room, dir. Michael Webber, 100m

A film about the controversial world of exotic animal ownership within the suburbs of the United States. THE ELEPHANT IN THE LIVING ROOM offers an unprecedented glimpse into the fascinating subculture of raising the most deadly and exotic animals in the world as common household pets.

Turning a Corner, dir. Salome Chasnoff, 57m

“Turning a Corner” was created in a media activism workshop that director Salome Chasnoff facilitated with 15 women who were street prostitutes in Chicago. Shot on the street corners across Chicago where they once traded sex, the film features the women’s survival and triumph over sexual abuse, homelessness, violence and injustice.

Evilgreen, dir. Bobby Willis, 2m

Maybe a fake Christmas tree isn't so bad after all.

The Extraordinary Monday of Herman Brumby, dir. Ari Levinson, 5m

Herman Brumby was not a man who enjoyed Mondays. But this Monday was not like other Mondays.

Kavi, dir. Gregg Helvey, 19m

The 2010 Oscar nominated short film, 'Kavi', is about a boy in India who wants to play cricket and go to school, but instead he is forced to work in a brick kiln as a modern-day slave. Unsatisfied with his fate, Kavi must choose to either accept what he's always been told, or fight for a different fate even if he's unsure of the ultimate outcome.

Lights, dir. Giulio Ricciarelli, 15m

A tragicomic story of a small-town police officer who dreams of being a hero. As his peaceful village offers no opportunity for heroism, he decides to take matters in his own hands. He puts up a traffic light on a rarely - used bridge in the middle of nowhere - and the fight begins.

Moustachette, dir. Patrick Stump, 16m

A quest for truth in a blanket of stupidity.

The New Tenants, dir. Joachim Back, 20m

A prying neighbor, a glassy-eyed drug dealer, and a husband brandishing both a weapon and a vendetta make up the welcome wagon. Set amidst the as-yet-unopened boxes and the hopes for a fresh start of two men on what might just be the worst moving day ever, their new apartment reveals its terrifying history in a film that is by turns funny, frightening, and unexpectedly romantic.

Pastrami on Rye, dir. Gio Toninelo, 6m

Two soldiers have a day long conversation about the field manual and going back home.

Path Lights, dir. Zachary Sluser, 22m

Bobby (John Hawkes) is the voice of pulpy detective serials on audio, as well as the automated answering service of a tree cutting company. One day, when walking his dogs in the Pasadena arroyo, a bottle falls from the sky, almost hitting him. Bobby decides, based on the obscure brand of beer, to trace down the culprit.

Piquo, dir. Paul Yee, 19m

Piquo lives on the Arctic tundra. There are only five students in her high school class, and she is the only one without a date to the prom. She spends a quiet day all by herself.

Poi Dogs, dir. Joel Moffett, 12m

Poi Dogs is the story of two local Hawaii teenagers who take a small step towards love by moving beyond their desires to act cool.

Predilection, dir. Marcio Garcia, 17m

Seven men, one woman, one plan: the perfect bank job. But one small unforeseen glitch leads the band of robbers into a deadly shootout throughout the city of Rio de Janeiro...or was it really unforeseen?

Rapper-O's – Dumbfoundead, dir. Adam Stanzak, 4m

Dumbfoundead the Rapper makes a music video for his hit single 'Rapper-O's' a song about eating wacky Emcees for breakfast.

Refresh, dir. David Orr, 12m

A wealthy but chronically depressed businessman at the end of his rope hires a mysterious company who provide an effective - but irrevocable - solution.

Shop Secret, dir. Danny Prussman, 14m

Scotty Kapoor (Ravi Patel) is a secret shopper who's dream is to be a secret agent. In order to prove his worth to the FBI, his father / boss (Kumar Pallana), and his ex-girlfriend, he must solve a case at one of his 'shop' locations before he gets fired for not focusing on his job.

Climate Refugees, dir. Michael Nash, 83m

CLIMATE REFUGEES is a documentary film that uncovers the unbelievable plight of people around the world displaced by climatically induced environmental disasters.

Split Estate, dir. Debra Anderson, 74m

Imagine discovering that you don't own the mineral rights under your land, and that an energy company plans to drill for natural gas two hundred feet from your front door. Split Estate maps a tragedy in the making, as citizens in the path of a new drilling boom in the Rocky Mountain West struggle against the erosion of their civil liberties, their communities and their health.

When the Dragon Swallowed the Sun, dir. Dirk Simon, 112m

The lack of progress toward a free, or even a truly autonomous Tibet, urges more and more young Tibetans to consider alternatives to the Dalai Lama's Middle Way Policy, a compromise on Tibet's Independence. The controversial discussion about the right strategy for achieving a free Tibet - non-violent or violent, autonomy or complete independence - is becoming more emotionally charged day by day.
